### FEBRUARY'S MICROLIGHT TRIP – WESTERN WANDER

### An update from Gary Wheeler follows:

Just an update for everyone to pass on information that you may not be aware of.

The attendees so far are Steve Bell and partner Heather, John Waite, Josef Ferstl, Kel Glare, Max Glynn, Graham Keen, Dean Marriot, Russell Purdy, Ian Rees, Reg Thaggard, David Watson, Steve Ruffles, Chris Bullen, George Vassis and Penelope Vostek.

We will have a 12 seater bus and Steve Bell's car and trailer as ground support vehicles with Heather, Penelope, Chris and Graham as drivers.

The trip will start from Flowerdale but people can join at any spot along the route that suits their needs. The route tracks past many airfields that may be more suitable for some. If you wish to join at a location other than Flowerdale please let me know so I can factor it into the itinerary.

All pilots must supply their own portable fuel cans *appropriately labelled* for the ground crew as required.

Each pilot will need to pass on to me a \$100 deposit by or on the December 14 club meeting to ensure their place. The \$100 deposit is for the bus hire and any leftover will go to the ground crew fuel bill. The ground crew vehicle expenses will be split evenly by all the pilots attending as required. Each pilot will be responsible for their own expenses, e.g. fuel, food and accommodation. *It should be noted that in the event that the bus is involved in an accident there is up to a \$2000 excess payable* that would have to be shared by all.

It is estimated that the total expense for the trip to be approximately \$1000.

The accommodation on the 22nd Feb will be at The Grampians a private airfield with cabin accommodation and a restaurant that will be opened for us on the night. The 24<sup>th</sup> Feb will be at the Torrumbarry Hotel.

Because we will not be sure whether we will be in Colac or Peterborough on the first night no accommodation bookings have been made. Either of these location have plenty of accommodation options so there will be no problems. Hopefully the third night will be at Ouyen and there are also plenty of accommodation options here.

All pilots must have a working VHF radio and EPIRB for the trip. Any pilot that does not have appropriate qualifications or endorsement should note that there will be a CFI and Instructor on the trip and they should make good use of this facility.

Each day there will be a morning briefing for weather reports and NOTAMS and to organize the morning teas, lunch stops and fuelling requirements for the day.

For pilots that are new to cross country trips ensure that you have appropriate tie down equipment for your trike overnight.

The maps you will need to study and carry are WAC Adelaide, WAC Hamilton and Melbourne VNC or VTC.
